








#### The GRANTHAM CANAL HERITAGE INITIATIVE

#### Flora & Fauna along the Grantham Canal by James Faulconbridge

November is typically the tail-end of the flowering season – the majority of the late flowering species have come to an end and the early spring flowers such as snowdrop and arum lily are still a couple of months off. However this autumn has been surprisingly mild and there are still some good splashes of colour to be seen along the Grantham Canal.

The stretch of the canal which runs from The Drift in Harlaxton through to the A1 at Grantham is set in a cutting which provides sheltered conditions, allowing for late-flowering plants to persist longer into the autumn and winter before the cold and frost finish them off. Seventeen species were still flowering in the middle of November.

Some of these have typically long seasons – species such as the yellow-flowered wood avens, the delicate-pink herb Robert, annual meadowgrass and white dead-nettle can be found flowering from spring right through into the autumn. Red and white campion too were both still in flower side-by-side on the rising banks beside the tow-path.

Some species had just the odd flower still hanging in there – the subtle-green ivy flowers are a great source of autumn nectar and can be found buzzing with bees and hoverflies through September and October, and just a few flowers were still open in November. The brambles have been mostly picked clean of blackberries by the flocks of fieldfares which have recently arrived, but in amongst the browning leaves were a few off-white flowers making a final futile attempt.

There were was even the odd spring flowering species which was flowering out of season – perhaps due to the mild conditions. Forget-me-not, which proliferate in April and May, had a few skyblue flowers newly opened.
