The WRG guys (lads & lasses) have given a week of their time – and some hard earned cash – to spend their days on a number of tasks including rebuilding the lock, profiling the canal bed (it needs to have years of silt removed and we need to calculate just how much) up to the Dirty Duck and planning the

access route to Lock 14. Their nights are spent camping in Cropwell Bishop Memorial Hall. The society is very appreciative of WRG commitment to our restoration project. That increase in bookings is being maintained for August and we appreciate the dedication of the boat crews. ## THE WAY IT WAS

Another unusual job came our way after the canal museum was completed. John Cockcroft contacted me to say a quarry near Breaston had unearthed some old timbers which could be from an early wooden boat and would he like to send a team to identify or remove the remains. So about ten of us were able to access the site during the weekend work break.

Luckily the area around the timbers was reasonably dry and was typical Trent gravel and sand. We were pre-warned by John to be careful with the dig so not to damage any more timber so he could examine the remains to bring back to the museum if historically important. It took several hours to remove enough material to expose the keelson, knees, bottom and gunwale, etc , it was then up to John to visit the site to try to identify the exposed remains. It turned out that the boat was a normal wooden butty narrowboat, probably less than 100 years old. The conclusion being that several had been sunk to stabilise the bank where a leak had occurred because the Trent river was very close at this point.

So the project was abandoned and the remains destroyed as quarrying continued.

It was a very interesting and educational job, a far cry from the norm and a pity not to have had a better conclusion.

## Grantham Canal Society Announce Launch of New Fundraising Initiative

Many members of the public and the volunteers of the Grantham Canal Society share a common frustration – the amount of weed and the extent of the shallows on significant parts of the Grantham Canal. The unrestored sections are obviously the worse but this summer parts of the restored section have become depressingly repopulated by rafts of weed, reeds and bits of floating timber.

Our workboat "Centurai" and its crew strive valiantly to keep the situation under control but as with so many aspects of the canal we need more resources; volunteers and money. Our weedboat "Osberton" is back in commission and our dredger is scheduled for more work but much more needs to be done. Our potential problem is that the more canal we restore the more that we have to maintain so the sooner we get a grip on this the better.

In the next issue of "Bridge" we will detail this New Fundraising Initiative but let it be noted that it was one of our members who stimulated it. Sharing his frustration at the state of the canal in parts he made a £200 donation, which since we talked to him about the new fund he has increased to £300.

Thanks Terry – we always welcome constructive input from our members.


